HB 198 (Rep. Thierry): Relating to providing mental health services and mental health education to public school students at school-based health centers.

HB 204 (Rep. Thierry): Relating to the inclusion of instruction about mental health in the required curriculum for public school students.

HB 241 (Rep. Farrar, Rep. Beckley): Relating to the Medicaid eligibility of certain women after a pregnancy. (Companion bills: SB 147 by Sen. Rodriguez, SB 308 by Sen. Watson, HB 411 by Rep. Thierry, HB 610 by Rep. Walle, HB 744 by Rep. Rose)

HB 253 (Rep. Farrar): Relating to a strategic plan to address postpartum depression.

HB 316 (Rep. Howard): Relating to a public awareness campaign on firearm safety and suicide prevention.

HB 342 (Rep. Cortez): Relating to the period of continuous eligibility for the medical assistance program.

HB 363 (Rep. Jarvis Johnson): Relating to the creation of the office of independent oversight ombudsman for the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

HB 394 (Rep. Minjarez): Relating to the duties of a hearing officer following a Health and Human Services Commission fair hearing regarding the denial of certain services

HB 471 (Rep. Thierry): Relating to required suicide prevention training for certain health care practitioners.

HB 501 (Rep. Senfronia Thompson): Relating to the requirement and study of insurance coverage for serious emotional disturbance of a child. (Companion bill by Sen. Zaffirini: SB 314)

HB 517 (Rep. Israel): Relating to unprofessional conduct by mental health providers who attempt to change the sexual orientation of a child; providing penalties.

HB 565 (Rep. Coleman): Relating to healthcare coverage in this state.

HB 606 (Rep. Thierry): Relating to the automatic enrollment of certain women in the Healthy Texas Women program. (Companion bill by Sen. Miles: SB 189)

HB 822 (Rep. Parker): Relating to addressing adverse childhood experiences and developing a strategic plan to address those experiences.

HB 906 (Rep. Senfronia Thompson): Relating to the establishment of a collaborative task force to study certain public school mental health services.

HB 1069 (Rep. Price): Relating to consideration of the mental health of public school students in training requirements for certain school employees, curriculum requirements, counseling programs, educational programs, state and regional programs and services, and health care services for students and to mental health first aid program training and reporting regarding local mental health authority and school district personnel.

SB 344 (Sen. Watson): Relating to the participation of campus-based mental health professionals in certain health benefit plans.

SB 355 (Sen. West): Relating to developing a strategic plan to ensure the provision of prevention and early intervention services complies with federal law.

SB 429 (Sen. Lucio): Relating to a comprehensive plan for increasing and improving the workforce in this state to serve persons with mental health and substance use issues.

SB 500, Section 10 (Sen. Nelson): Supplemental appropriations, funding to continue improving the state hospital system.

SB 580 (Sen. Campbell): Relating to modification of certain prescription drug benefits and coverage offered by certain health benefit plans.
